Playing with Danger

In many people's houses, spiders are not welcome guests. Even though they are good at catching insects, most spiders found in houses are killed.

There are however some lands in the world where spiders grow very large and some of them are deadly poisonous—places such as Africa or South America, especially in the jungles and rain forests. There are pictures of spiders that are over six inches across or larger. We have heard a story of a missionary in Africa who had a very frightening experience with one of these large, poisonous spiders. Instead of immediately killing the spider with his stick, the missionary stood about 5 feet away from the spider and began teasing it by touching it lightly with the end of his stick. After a few moments, the missionary moved the stick slowly away from the spider, towards his own legs. It was then that the spider suddenly jumped on the stick trying to bite it!

The missionary could see the poison from its fangs running down the end of the stick. Realizing how foolish he had been to 'play' with this dangerous and deadly spider, he immediately killed it.

The spider's strike on the stick had been very accurate and if it had decided to attack the missionary's leg rather then the stick, he surely would have been bitten and been in danger of dying from the poison.

Perhaps, as you read this, you think that you would certainly know better than to tease and play with a poisionsous spider. But, dear reader, are you playing with something far more deadly than that spider?

Are you playing with sin? Sin is a deadly enemy—whether telling a lie, being disobedient, or doing something secretly—something you know is wrong—or doing many, many other things like these. These sins are but a few of Satan's traps to lead you to everlasting punishment. God tells us in Ezekiel 18:4 that "The soul that sinneth, it shall die". God is holy and must punish sin. Perishing eternally in an awful place called 'hell' is the punishment God must use for those who sin and He tells us that "all have sinned".

How can you-how can anyone-be freed from Satan's awful power? Escape is only to be found through faith in what the Lord Jesus Christ, God's eternal, beloved only begotten Son, has done at Calvary's cross.
